The Tribunal has reviewed the parties' letters of 9 March, 11 March and 11 March 2005 and directs as follows:

Filing deadlines

23 March 2005	- UPS' memorial due
22 June 2005	- Canada's counter memorial due
5 August 2005	- UPS' reply due
19 September 2005	- Canada's rejoinder due
19 October 2005	- Article 1128 submissions due; amici submissions due
2 November 2005	- Responses to article 1128 submissions due; responses to amici submissions due

Means of production to Tribunal

The Tribunal accepts the means proposed by UPS.

Redaction of restricted access and confidential information

No further ruling need be made on this matter at this stage. The parties may address the issue further before Canada files its counter memorial.

Non disputing Parties

The parties are agreed that the non disputing Parties are entitled to unredacted versions. The Tribunal directs that for convenience they also have the redacted versions.

The Tribunal seeks Canada's response, by 23 March 2005, to UPS' point about requests for access to information being made under relevant Mexican or US law.
